

HISTORY

New Rochelle was founded in 1688 by the French Huguenots, is one of the oldest cities in the Northeast, and has 9 miles of spectacular shoreline along the Long Island Sound. Both the history and waterfront shape the character of this vibrant City.

New Rochelle has charming tree-lined neighborhoods, high-rise living, and housing options for nearly every budget.

There is fun to be had at New Roc City where you can take in a movie at the Regal Cinemas New Roc 18 IMAX, ride the carousel, bowl, skate, play mini-golf and more.

EDUCATION

The New Rochelle City School District serves more than 10,000 students from grades K-12.

There are 6 neighborhood elementary schools for K-5: Columbus, George M. Davis, Jefferson, Trinity, William B. Ward and Daniel Webster.

The Barnard Early Childhood Center Magnet School is a challenging program offering a specially designed 4-year sequence for elementary age students.

There are 2 neighborhood middle schools serving grades 6-8: Albert Leonard and Isaac Young. Special programs include accelerated math and science classes, exciting music and drama programs and an accelerated biology program connected with Montefiore New Rochelle Hospital.

EDUCATION (continued)

New Rochelle High School enrolls approximately 3400 students. Students may choose from an extensive array of honors, AP and elective courses. New Rochelle also has a Performing and Visual Arts Education Program (PAVE) for students who wish to major in the arts, as well as other noteworthy programs.

The impressive French-Gothic style high school is fronted by 2 lakes and Huguenot Park. Facilities include an indoor pool, 8 tennis courts, 2 football fields and a planetarium.

Some of the private | parochial schools in the immediate area are: Thornton-Donovan, The Ursuline, Hudson Country Montessori, Salesian, Blessed Sacrament and St. Gabriel's.

Colleges in the area include: Iona and New Rochelle.

RECREATION

The New Rochelle Department of Parks and Recreation provides year-round programs in sports, cultural pursuits, and leisure activities for residents of all ages.

There are 35 parks, playgrounds, sports fields and tot lots located City-wide, as well as a skateboard park.

There are beaches at Hudson Park and a small outdoor swimming pool with a water slide, wading pool and water spray at Lincoln Park.

The 15 public tennis courts are located at Pinebrook Tennis Center, Albert Leonard Middle School and New Rochelle High School.

There is a municipal marina with 350 boat slips, 150 mooring, and kayak storage.
